My analysis is finished...now what?

Presentation

- Your Science Fair project presentation should grab people's attention
 - Story boards are a great way to display your project
 - Make sure that the title is clear and someone can tell what your project is about
 - Be careful and do not overuse fancy colors and graphics. Few used correctly is better than many used incorrectly.
 - Ask yourself “Will someone seeing this for the first time understand what I am doing?”

Photos

- Photos made during your project are a great way to capture someone's attention
 - Make sure that photos are clear and that you know and follow the policy about including photos in your presentation.
 - Your journal of your project is also another spot that you can include additional photos that you took while doing your project

Journal

- A journal is the best way to describe every single thing that you learned along the way.
 - Use your journal to show what you learned, not just reproduce the pages you have on the storyboard
 - Highlight things that went well...as well as some of the things that did not go so well
 - Be sure to check your grammar and spell checking. Don't rely on a computer to do it (A computer would tell you that their are know words spelled wrong in this sentence!!)
